- 2.2 I am familiar with the investigative report in 10C-4112 and the following information is contained in that report:

On 04-19-10, at approximately 2150hrs, in Lewis County, LCSO patrols were dispatched to a report of an interrupted residential burglary at 2155 SR 508, in Onalaska. The units were advised that one of the suspected burglars, identified as Thomas McKenzie, had been shot by the homeowner, Ronald Allen Brady. The other suspect, JOANNA DARLENE MCKENZIE, DOB 05-06-78, had fled the scene and flagged down a passing motorist and contacted 911 with the person's cell phone.

Deputy Adkisson, LCSO, had been out to the same residence earlier in the day in response an earlier report of someone unlawfully entering Mr. Brady's residence. The residence in question, was in the process of being rebuilt. At the earlier time, Mr. Brady informed Adkisson that someone moved various items he was storing in his garage. Mr. Brady also noticed the door to his garage was partially open, and a back window had been broken. No suspect information was obtained at that time.

Shortly after 2150hrs, Detective Kimsey contacted the homeowner, Mr. Brady. Mr. Brady stated he noticed several items in his garage had been moved when he had been away from his home between 1515 and 1645hrs that afternoon. Mr. Brady, who was currently living in a rental home while the 2155 SR 508 residence was being rebuilt, stated he decided to stay at the residence to see if the burglars would return. Mr. Brady stated that sometime around 2100hrs, during hours of darkness, he saw a vehicle with its headlights illuminated pull into his driveway. Mr. Brady said from where he was at inside his house, he could see straight through into the garage. Mr. Brady stated he saw the light from the vehicle's headlights emanate through the partially opened garage door. Mr. Brady said he grabbed his .22 caliber rifle and made his way toward the garage door. Mr. Brady said the lights on the vehicle were then turned off and he heard someone knocking on his door. Mr. Brady stated he tripped over something, making a noise which alerted the persons outside. Mr. Brady stated that he heard someone pound on a wall and say something to the effect that the police were coming. Mr. Brady stated he went into his garage and opened the garage door. At that point, Mr. Brady stated he saw two flashlights being shined at his face. Mr. Brady then opened fire at one of the flashlights. It was determined the person holding that flashlight was Thomas McKenzie. Mr. McKenzie had been killed and lay face down in the grass in front of Mr. Brady's house. The other participant, JOANNA MCKENZIE, when seeing her husband fall to the ground, exclaimed "you shot my husband!", before she ran from the scene. Mr. Brady stated after shooting Mr. McKenzie, he opened fire on JOANNA MCKENZIE.

Deputy Riordan, LCSO, made contact was made with JOANNA MCKENZIE, who was inside an aid vehicle. Riordan informed MCKENZIE of her Miranda warnings and asked her what had happened. MCKENZIE stated that he had been picked up by her husband in his brown truck, which was still at the scene. MCKENZIE said that a friend gave her and her husband permission to take parts off a white truck parked in his driveway. MCKENZIE stated they neared the residence (Mr. Brady's residence) and her husband missed the driveway. MCKENZIE said they turned around and went back to the residence. MCKENZIE said her husband was going to see if anyone was awake. MCKENZIE said her husband knocked on the door before he came back to the front of the house and told her he thought there were kids inside. MCKENZIE said that her husband banged on the wall and yelled, "the cops are on the way so you better get out of the house!" MCKENZIE stated she and her husband both had flashlights because the area was very dark. MCKENZIE stated the garage door was then flung open and a lone male subject began shooting at them. MCKENZIE stated she tried to get back into the truck to call 911, but stopped when the man began shooting at her. MCKENZIE stated she saw her husband try and run, but heard him yell, "Ow! Ow! Ow!" before collapsing in front of the white truck parked in the driveway. MCKENZIE stated she ran toward SR 508 and flagged down a motorist to contact 911. MCKENZIE said she managed to flag down someone and used their cell phone to contact 911. MCKENZIE stated at that time she threw the gloves and stocking cap she was wearing away. Inside Mr. McKenzie's truck were two bolt cutters, a pair of pry bars, a pipe wrench, and a drill, among other items.

Based on the above, the State requests that the suspect, JOANNA DARLENE MCKENZIE, be detained subject to conditions of release.
